Spellings


Please support your children in learning the weekly spelling rules. A termly grid will be sent home and the children will be given be tested on their spellings each Tuesday.

English

Autobiography and biography- in this sequence, the children will be learning about Roald Dahl's life linked to the text 'Boy'. They will then be creating their own biographies about famous British people.

Short Stories with flashbacks - the children will be using extracts from famous British authors' books to explore stories which use flashbacks. They will understand how writers use different structures to create coherence and impact and use this in their own writing.

Modern Fiction- 'A Lion in Paris'



We will be covering a range of objectives throughout the year. These build on prior learning but at a greater depth as the year progresses.

- Number Sense (3 weeks)
- Additive reasoning (3 weeks)
- Multiplicative Reasoning (3 Weeks)
- Geometric Reasoning (2 Weeks)
 - Number Sense (2 Weeks)

Science

Year 6 will cover all of the topics that the children have experienced during the last 3 years but at a greater depth. This term we will be looking at...

- Electricity- circuits
- Forces and influencial British Scientists.
- Light and its properties.

History

Although our topic work has a geography focus we will naturally explore the history of our locality as we investigate the development of the village.

We will also be running a series of drama workshops with the University of Exeter and visiting artists looking at the history of Devington Park.

Art and Design Technology

This term we will focus on drawing skills and observational drawing. We will look at using graded pencils to create different effects and explore line, tone and shade. Our work will be inspired by the local area and we will visit different locations in the village to carry out some observational drawing from real life.

In DT we will use mouldable materials for model making, exploring a range of resources to inform designs.

Computing

New Beginnings

New beginnings – The children will explore their rights and responsibilities and consider how to cope with a variety of feelings After half term, the children will learn about getting on and falling out, what is in the news and saying no to bullying.

Geography Ty will be the evol

Our main area of study will be the evolution and development of the village of Exminster. We will be looking at geographical enquiry and map reading skills. We will explore Ordnance Survey maps and look at changes and developments over time. We will collect information and data through observation and fieldwork using the local area. We will choose the best way to collect information needed and decide the most appropriate units of measure. We will use our data to inform our thinking. We will use maps, aerial photos, plans and web resources to describe what our locality is like and why it has developed in this way.

Modern Languages

Speaking: The children will hold a simple conversation with at least 3-4 exchanges.

Writing: The children will use set phrases they know and adapt them according to different contexts.

Reading and Responding: The children will look at a factual text and note some of the main points.

Listening and Responding: The children will identify the main points of a spoken piece.

Music

This term our focus will be on_singing songs for performance. We will look at exploring different parts and changing the dynamics of our performance. We will look at and appraise the work of some different *a cappella* groups and try to apply some of their skills to our own work.

Physical Education

Outdoor PE: During the first half term, the children will be improving their tactics within Tag Rugby. This will involve the children improving their passing and catching accuracy and working as a team to score as many points as possible. During the second half, the children will be refining their team working skills through outdoor education.

Indoor PE: For the first half term the children will be creating and structuring motifs, phrases, sections and whole dances. After half term the children will be developing their own gymnastic sequences by understanding, choosing and applying a range of compositional principles.

Religious Education

What do people believe about life? Beliefs and questions – The Journey of Life and Death.

The children will consider and discuss their feelings and understanding of birth, death, the natural world and their place in it. They will also find out what other religions and beliefs systems believe about the meaning and origin of life.
