Outcomes to Date:

Participation

Sports clubs run in school so far this year: football club (x3), netball club, tag rugby, gymnastics, Dartmoor3Ball – open to various age groups across KS1 and KS2. External provider offering football (Foundation Stage and KS1), gymnastics (FS, KS1, KS2), dance and cricket.

100% participation – We are on course for every child in the school to participate in at least one festival/event over the year, in a variety of events in Rec, KS1 and KS2 – tag rugby, High 5 netball, Change4Life, handball, cricket, swimming, cross country, badminton, boys futsal, aquasplash, Year 4 gymnastics, Year 1 Dance sharing festival and gymnastic tournaments.

PE Learning Team is continuing to develop. They have produced a sports newspaper documenting the school's sports events. They have also helped to deliver the Change4Life club.

Progress

Enhanced package feedback forms have shown staff feel more knowledgeable and skilled in teaching PE with a focus on supporting least able and developing the most able learners. Staff's confidence has increased which has improved the level of teaching further still.

Daily vigorous activity has continued across KS2. KS1 are beginning to implement daily physical activity.

Change4Life Club has continued to progress by providing PP/Service children in Year 3/4 with active challenges on a Wednesday lunchtime, and they've been able to attend three events across the course of the year.

Intervention

- The Fun fit training has enabled pupils to develop their gross motor skills. Children involved show progress, and if progress is not in line with that of their peers, a referral to the SPA for further support – 3 referrals made as a result of their involvement.
- Family FUNS programme for families to develop playing active skills together, led by 2 teachers and an LSA.

Sport Premium planned spending for 2017 – 2018

Funding for the next year will buy into:

- Dartmoor School Sports Partnership
- Supporting the teaching in year groups through use of specialist teachers
- Continuing to offer a range of after-school/lunchtime active clubs/before school club
- Possible minibus lease
- PE administration in organisation of events
