Rainbow day: On **Tuesday 11th July**, we will be celebrating our summer Rainbow Day. The children are welcome to come to school in **non-uniform** of their choice – the brighter the better!

We will be exploring the theme of 'One Place, Many Stories': the children will be considering their sense of place in our school and community, sharing activities across year groups.

Civic award: When children are in Y6, they get the opportunity to be involved with the Torbay and Devon Civic award. This is a 6 month project where children are involved and evidence their involvement in different areas. Mrs Nowell introduced our school to the Torbay and Devon Civic award several years ago now. The children started the award in October and have been working hard on it over this year. There are several sections to complete: Fundraising for a chosen charity, Being an active citizen in the school community, Being an active citizen in the local community, Pursuing an active hobby, Pursuing a non-active hobby, Adventure training and a pledge to the planet. Throughout the award, the children have shown their commitment, developed confidence, started new skills and made an impact to the communities of which they are part of. It is an amazing achievement. Here are just a few of the activities the children have been involved in:

- Gaining a Devon Wildlife Trust bat buddy bronze award
- Enjoying new hobbies such as arts and crafts, hockey, tennis, cross country, dance, bike riding, netball, golf, fitness, horse riding, photography, football, colouring, knitting, reading
- Running sponsored events to raise money for a chosen charity
- Raising money through making and selling products
- Learning a new language: Ukrainian, Spanish
- Running clubs in school for other year groups colouring, Scratch coding, dance
- Helping at the Environment fair, brownies, guides, looking after animals for others, running a stall at the environment fair



- Being a mental health ambassador in school, being a librarian, being part of the Eco team and School Learning team
- Doing many jobs and roles around school to support the smooth running of school eg. School Learning Team, refereeing, Rainbow buddy support, being part of the Eco team, being a school librarian
- Attending residential and being engaged in adventurous activity
- Supporting the organisation of the food bank collections in school, helping at the Christingle service
- Doing beach cleans, litter picking, switching off sockets, reducing the amount of plastic being bought, eating vegetarian meals, using reusable lids, turning off lights, making present bags with old material rather than using wrapping paper

Our thanks go to Mrs Nowell and Mrs Gibson for supporting the children and a huge well done to the children for what they have achieved in completing this and the journey they have been on with it. We are all very proud of them. - Wednesday 12 July: Years 5 and 6


