Tempest photography: The photographers will be coming into school on Thursday, 21 September, to take the children's photographs. Early Epic Breakfast Club and Epic Eve After School Club: Booking for next half term (Oct to Dec) will go live on School Gateway at 3pm on Monday 18 September. Dogs: Unfortunately we're unable to have dogs walking on leads on the school site. We understand that some young puppies can't be left at the gates and as such they may be carried through the playground but must not be put down at any time. We ask that owners to be very mindful of children and adults who may be wary of dogs.



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RAAC: You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. The Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated. We wanted to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal. We understand that parents may want to understand more about the support to educational settings to manage RAAC safely. You can read more through the article published by the DfE on the Education Hub.

Don't forget to apply for Pupil Premium funding (also known as Free School Meals, FSM): All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get universal free school meals. However, if you receive certain benefits, you are encouraged to apply for free school meals when you enrol at school, as this can help our school to attract additional 'pupil premium' funding to support your child's learning. If you are eligible for Pupil Premium funding, it will also give you access to food voucher codes at all supermarkets, £15 per week per child over holiday periods, and completely free childcare during holiday periods. We applied for and were awarded £200 for buying planters and herbs so that we can grow our own produce for use within our cooking.
