

Today's Nayamba fundraiser: Thank you for supporting today's fundraiser for Nayamba School. Nayamba school is in Zambia, Africa. There are 360 children on roll. In Zambia, families have to pay to send their children to go to the Government-run schools. Nayamba is a school that has been set up for local families who cannot afford to pay for their children to go to school. The school has been co-founded and maintained by a local Exminster group. The Nayamba Trust works closely with the school to develop good educational practice by supporting teacher training and development, and providing basics such as textbooks and electricity.

Children at Nayamba school go to school because they are desperate to get an education. Whilst at school, they also receive daily food. For 3 out of 10 of all children, this is the only food they will have for the day. 6 out of 10 children have that and one other meal and 1 out of 10 have 3 meals a day. Our fundraiser will support the essential food programme that gives all the children a meal. This food programme costs £1.40 per month to feed one child. We are asking families to donate, via School Gateway, £1.40 to fund one child's food programme for one month. Of course, people can donate whatever they choose to support this worthy cause. I have had the privilege of visiting the school in 2016 and 2017, working with the teachers and working with the children. I have seen first-hand, the wonderful work that is done in this school. The aim of this club is to provide time for the children to develop strategies for supporting their mental health.

Community Library: every Wednesday, our community library will continue to be open for families to come in and look/borrow from the books we have available. Over the last few years, it has been built up further and will be open on a Wednesday morning each week from 8:50am until the school gate close around 9:10am. On request, you can access this resource bank at any time. The Community Library is a collection of books available for parents to borrow. We have books on topics that parents have regularly asked for support with including sleep, positive mental health, parenting different age groups of children, anxiety, bereavement, illness, divorce and lots more. The books will be on display in the lounge area next to the office. Feel free to come in and have a browse or borrow one if you think it may be useful. There is a book to sign books out and back in.

SHOE BOX APPEAL 2024: As you know the world is still very troubled by conflict where innocent people are affected and children often orphaned. Christian Response to Eastern Europe (Cr2ee) has continued over the last year to extend the humanitarian aid it was sending to Moldova to the people of Ukraine, Moldova's neighbours, even though this has stretched their resources. A huge amount of humanitarian aid, including medical supplies has been distributed. For the traumatised children and their families, shoeboxes at Christmas will be even more important in showing that they are not forgotten. Our shoebox appeal is about to start and we hope you will be able to join in this amazing project, despite the difficulties many are facing at home. We will need to collect the shoeboxes from participating schools and groups throughout November. These will be going to children and families in both Moldova and Ukraine. The children are truly thrilled to receive a Christmas shoebox; generally boxes should be wrapped and properly secured. If you can pop in a card, a photograph or message with your address, even better. The shoeboxes can be for an individual boy or girl while a larger one could be for a family. Please label the boxes - boy, girl or family - with appropriate age ranges where feasible and drop them off in school on Thursday 28 Nov. We know times are difficult and so children are welcome to club together to donate joint boxes. Attached is a list of useful items for a shoebox.
