Rainbow Day, Monday 18 November: On Monday 18 November we are inviting children to come dressed in their own clothes, as bright as they want to be, to celebrate our first Rainbow Day of the academic year. We have one Rainbow Day every term, on this day the normal curriculum is replaced with focused activities around different themes.

During our whole school Rainbow Day this term, we will be looking at: Anti Bullying, 'Choosing Respect' and Road Safety. Our KS2 children will also have a short input and roleplay from a company called 'Tiny Travels'. During this session they will explore situations where people stand up to racism. KS1 children will have time to explore a range of books with an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) focus, as well as practise using the zebra crossing safety outside of school.

We have set up a payment item for any families who would like to make a donation on Rainbow Day. Any money raised from this day will go directly to our community library to add some additional titles that we want to purchase to support families. The total cost of these titles is £115 so any money raised on this day will support with these books and other future titles to expand our diversity of texts.

Future donations days: we will give you further information about these dates nearer to the time but these are two future dates when we will be asking for donations:



- Friday 15 November, money donations in exchange for non-school uniform, via School gateway: we will be raising funds for Nayamba charity (further information to follow) https://www.nayamba.org/. Vanessa Pestridge, trustee and co-founder of the charity, will be coming in to talk to the children about the school on Friday 8 November and how the funds will support the future development.
- 2. Friday 22 November: hamper donations in exchange for non-school uniform. On this date we ask that families donate an item for hampers that will be made up, ready to sell draw tickets at our Rec, Y2 and Christmas carols in the yard events (items such as mince pies, chocolate, toiletries, wine, candles, tea/coffee, biscuits etc). The hampers are made up by our ESA volunteers and tickets sold for these at the Reception nativity, the Y2 performance and the Carols in the yard.

SWGfL e-safety workshop: A huge thank you to the Exminster School association (ESA) who funded this workshop. The ESA identified that this would support all age groups and an aspect that is so essential for parents to have highlighted the positives, the difficulties and thoughts on how to support their children through the digital world. A great enrichment opportunity for parents with essential information that will help parents support their children.

It was a very informative online safety session with Boris Radanovic who works for the South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL). SWGfL are a charitable trust dedicated to empowering the safe and secure use of technology. They are proud to be a world leader in online child safety. Boris was able to discuss the massive benefits and potential pitfalls through an interactive presentation. We are hoping to share some of the resources in the near future.
